THE POWER OF CLEAN WATER

Providing Clean Water

- \$24 is all it takes to provide one person with safe water
- 23 mil people now have safe water because of Rotary
- 21 mil people have access to sanitation and hygiene thanks to Rotary projects
- 2030 is the year Rotary hopes to finish providing everyone with safe water, sanitation, and hygiene



BREAKING THE CYCLE OF POVERTY



- \$9.2 mil- the amount The Rotary Foundation has spent to grow local economies and reduce poverty last year
- 795 mil people or 1 in 9 people in the world do not have enough to eat
- 60% of the world's hungry people are women and girls

• 70% of the world's poorest people live in rural areas and depend on agriculture and related activities for their livelihood

DISTRICT OFFERING MATCHING FUNDS INCENTIVES 2017-18

- Through the Global Grants and District Grants programs
- Rotarian involvement required
 - Not just check writing to other organizations or activities implemented primarily by non-Rotary organizations

GLOBAL GRANTS OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM DETAILS

- Projects with Water & Sanitation Area of Focus will receive additional matching District Designated Funds (DDF)
 - Up to \$1,000 for the Sponsoring Club
 - Up to \$250 for each District 6450 collaborating Club (\$2,000 max per grant)
- Global Grant must be endorsed by District Grants Committee for District approval by June 30, 2018

- Available for:
 - Food Security projects locally
 - Clean Water projects outside District 6450
- District Grants will be 50% match of Club spending on a <u>reimbursable</u> basis
 - Minimum \$250 grant for a \$500 project
 - Maximum \$500 grant for a \$1,000 or greater project

- Clubs may submit 1 application
- Multiple Clubs may collaborate on a single project and file 1 application
- Email completed Application Form along with valid Proof of Payment for all expenses to <u>Grants@Rotary6450.net</u>
 - Acceptable Proof of Payment includes: cancelled checks, bank statements, bonafide itemized receipts
- File applications ASAP after project completion
- Application deadline is May 15, 2018
- No expenditures allowed prior to July 1, 2017

Going "Bateys" for Filters

In the eastern Dominican Republic, sugar cane cutters and their families, largely Haitian immigrants, live in very primitive conditions and have many health concerns, including prevalent waterborne illnesses. A recent Global Grant from Rotary International sponsored the purchase of 1560 Kohler Clarity water filters to provide potable water and to launch a new not for profit business to continue this WASH initiative in these communities.



In March 2017 a team of US Rotarians travelled to the Dominican Republic to begin implementation of work approved in the Rotary Global Grant to provide Kohler CLARITY water filters to residents of "bateys" – sugar cane villages. This was the first use of the new filter in the Dominican Republic, a grant funded program that will provide an initial 1560 filters to sugar cane cutters and their families. Cleaning the Rivers of the World - October 21 -22

Salvador Rico, of the Rotary Club of South Ukiah (California), District 5130, has been spearheading a campaign to clean-up the rivers of the world. Rivers are the source of drinking water for hundreds of millions of people. Check out their <u>Facebook</u> <u>Page</u> and <u>website</u>.

This project started four years ago, when his Rotary Club teamed up with clubs in District 4140 to clean-up the Ameca River in Mexico. This year over 1,000 people are anticipated to be involved in this annual clean-up event.

On October 21-22, Rotary clubs around the world (e.g. India,

Venezuela, Mexico, Turkey, Columbia, Ecuador and U.S.) will be involved in river clean-up projects.

WASRAG is excited about this project and will be sending out details shortly on how your club can take part in a river clean-up project on or around World Water Day (March 22, 2018).

WASH in Schools (WinS)

The very successful Adopt-A-School Program continues in the Niger Delta. This is a partnership with Procter & Gamble, H2O for Life, WASRAG, local Rotary Clubs and international supporting Rotary Clubs.

The program is currently seeking funding for five schools. A club can fund the whole project by providing \$5,700 - \$7,000, or multiple clubs can contribute \$500 - \$2,500 and jointly fund a project.
