THE ANNUAL FUND-SHARE SYSTEM





DISTRICT GRANTS THIS YEAR

- Each year, we allocate the <u>maximum</u> permitted dollars that the District receives in District Designated Funds to District Grants, to be used by the Clubs in our District
- Clubs get as they give, receiving back 25% of the funds they & their members previously donated
- This year, Clubs in our District have over \$70,000 available to spend on projects funded by District Grants
- Clubs have 55 projects planned for this year using District Grants, plus we have funds available for water, hunger and disaster relief projects



CHANGES TO OUR DISTRICT GRANT PROCESS

- A few years ago, applications and reports were done by hand.
- We progressed to a email-system, but everything was still done manually
- We tried a system based on Excel that improved the application and reporting process, but was a bit "buggy" and time-consuming to administer
- This year, we adopted a web-based application and reporting system that maintains and improves the ease of applying and reporting, and should greatly reduce the administrative burden of the program



THE NEW SYSTEM

- At the Atlanta Rotary International Convention this year, we learned of website set up by Rotarian Philippe Lamoise from the Torrey Pines (La Jolla) Rotary Club
- The website, matchinggrants.org, was originally designed to help match Clubs in his District to projects in Ethiopia that needed funding
- Phillipe has added the capability to administer
 District Grants to the website, and after testing it, we found it matched up very well to our current process

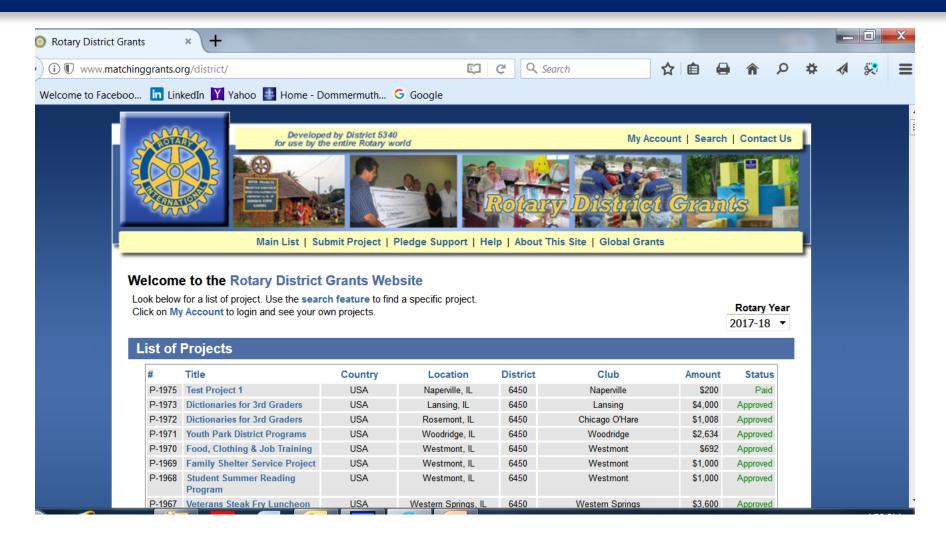

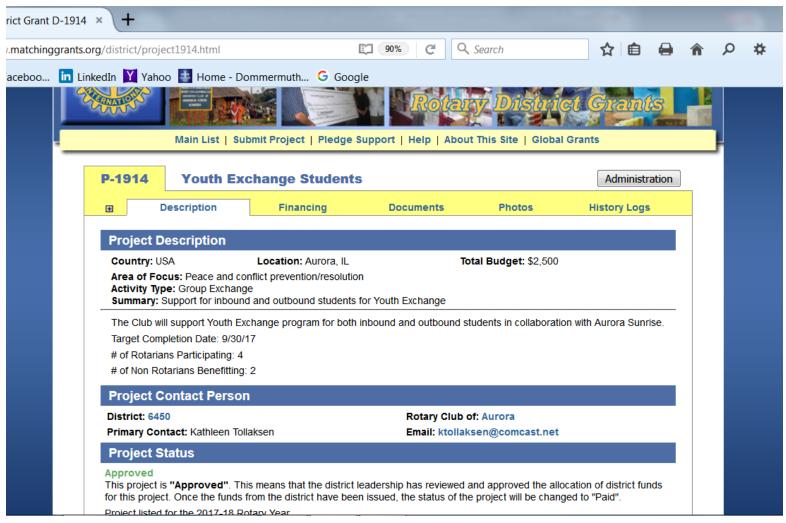

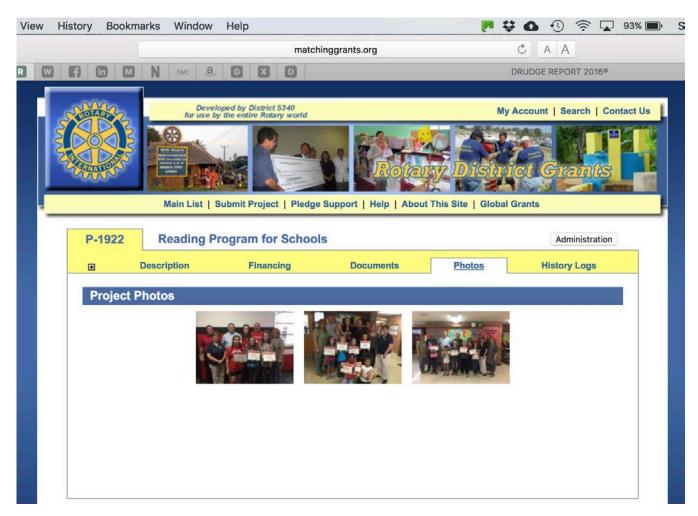


ADDING DOCUMENTS – USING ADMINISTRATION

CLUB ROLES

- All roles are assigned to individuals for a specific Rotary Year.
- Club Presidents are automatically given administrative access and added to the email distribution list for all the projects involving their club during their year and the year prior (as President-Elect)
- Assistant Governors are automatically given administrative access and added to the email distribution list for all the projects involving their clubs
- Primary Contacts receive all emails related to the Grant, and have access to prepare the Final Report
- Additional Contacts can be added to receive emails



WELCOME EMAIL – WHEN YOU START A GRANT OR ARE ADDED TO IT

 Once a Grant is started, or when new Rotarians are added to it, they receive an email from the website with their user name (email address) and a password to use to access the Grant

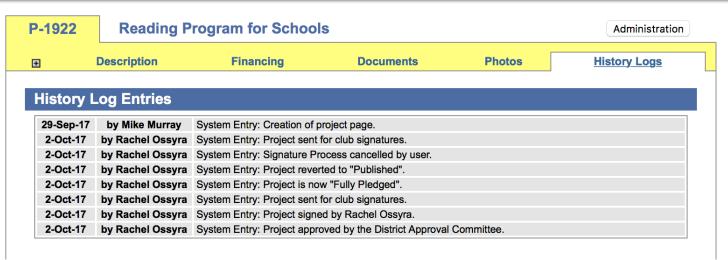
PROJECT STATUS

- As a District Grant project progresses from start to finish, it status will change:
 - Proposed
 - Looking for Funding
 - Fully Pledged
 - Submitted
 - Signed
 - Approved
 - Paid
 - Reported
 - Completed
- All projects in our District are now either Approved or Paid



HISTORY TAB

- A handy feature is the History Tab
- Under the History Tab, those with access to the Grant can share information about the Grant, such as what might be missing from a Final Report
- There is both a status update and an email function to the Grant's contacts





PROJECT STATUS - PAID

- Most District Grants are now marked "PAID", and checks have been mailed to the Clubs so marked
- If your Club grant is still at the "APPROVED" status, it means you owe something to someone before it is paid
 - E.g., District Dues, RI Dues, Global Grant report, or Annual Fund Goals
- An email goes out to let you know it has been PAID

FINAL REPORTS

- Project Final Reports are due within 30 days of project completion
- Final Report forms are downloaded from the website (go to Project / Administration / Description to get the form)
- Complete the form, save it as a pdf. document, and upload on the website (go to Project / Administration / Documents)



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW THIS YEAR

- The Grants Committee has already uploaded all of the District Grants, including Descriptions and Financing
- All Contact Persons on the Grant should have received an email saying the Grant was Approved, and most have received on saying it was Paid
- Next, make sure the check is received, and complete the **Project**
- Then prepare and submit the Final Report
- Next application cycle (May 2018), each Club will start at the beginning, creating the Grants themselves
- More training will be provided then
