All Chicago area students are invited to participate in a Peace Poetry Challenge sponsored by Rotary International Clubs in Chicago (District 6450) and The Peace School. Students can put in poetry their thoughts on what "What Does Peace Means to Me."

Participants: Elementary, Middle, High School Students

Poetry Theme: "What Does Peace Mean to Me" is the focus of the written or Spoken Word video poetry. Videos are limited to a maximum of two minutes.

Elementary Award: First place \$250; Second Place \$150; Third Place \$100

Middle School Award for Written Poetry: First place \$250; Second Place \$150; Third Place \$100 Middle School Award for Spoken Word Poetry: First place \$250; Second Place \$150; Third Place \$100

High School Award for Written Poetry: First place \$250; Second Place \$150; Third Place \$100 **High School Award for Spoken Word Poetry:** First place \$250; Second Place \$150; Third Place \$100

Deadline: Monday, November 16, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. for written poetry and two minute spoken word video.

Award Recipients: Awardees will be notified by December 11, 2020. Award winners can participate in a live webinar, with parent or guardian permission, where they can recite their poem or show their spoken word video.

Reviewers: The reviewers of the submissions are Rotarians and members and partners of The Peace School.

Ownership: All submitted written poetry or spoken word poetry will always be solely owned by the student.
